Why was Howard Carter's discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb so "wonderful?"

What is an Ammit? What was its purpose? What text was to help Egyptians survive the ritual od judgment?

How did the Kushites come to rule Egypt in the eighth century BCE?

What evidence suggests Egypt had contact with other civilizations?
