Attendance

Due to much of the learning is cumulative, interactive and participatory, attendance is required for all class meetings. Attendance is required for SLS 1122. Excused absences must be supported by third-party documentation (i.e. doctor's note). Unexcused absences will negatively impact your final grade.

No Show Policy: Please note, class attendance is required at the first class meeting. If you do not attend the first class meeting, you may be withdrawn from the class as a "no show." If you are withdrawn as a "no show," you will be financially responsible for the class and a final grade of "WN" will appear on your transcript for the course.

Please be on time to each class, complete all assignments, and remain in class for the entire time (unless prior permission has been given by the instructor to leave early). If you leave early without prior approval, it is documented as an absence. Three (3) absences, without adequate excuse will result in dropping of a letter grade at the end of the term.

Students are responsible for all work presented when they are absent, and are also responsible for any announcements made in class. Please note, communication is critical when you are unable to attend class. If due to an emergency and you miss a class, please call or email so that we can work together to help you get caught up.

Submission Policies

All work must adhere to the following requirements (unless stated otherwise):

- Include your name (first and last) and the date.
- Typed in paragraph style in double spaced legible 12-point font with one-inch margins on all sides (unless otherwise indicated in the assignment instructions)
- Proofread to remove excessive spelling and grammatical errors.
- Saved in an acceptable file format: .rtf, .doc(x), pdf, or .ppt(x) (when appropriate)
- Submissions should be clear with main points supported by details, examples, or explanations.

Remember, I am always here to assist you. For timely assistance, share your questions well in advance of the due date. I cannot guarantee that I will reply to your question or concern if you send them to me hours before a deadline.

- Make-up or late work is not accepted unless the Life Happens Clause is approved. (see additional information on the "Life Happens Clause" below).
- Technology issues are no excuse for late or missed work.
- Messaged or emailed homework is not accepted unless you have received instructions from me to do so.
- Exceptions to this policy are not guaranteed and are made at my discretion. You
 will need to message me within one week if you believe you had a unforeseen
 circumstance. Documentation may be requested.

Make-Up & Late Work

Situations may arise this semester that could prevent you from completing work. Therefore, you may invoke the Life Happens Clause **for one assignment, no questions asked**. Read the following guidelines:

Life Happens Clause

- Send me a message via Canvas Inbox or email titled, "Life Happens Clause" within 24 hours of the missed assignment.
- In your message, provide the assignment's name for which you would like to invoke the clause.
- After receiving my written approval, submit the completed assignment within three days or by the revised due date provided.
- Keep in mind that:
 - Grades of zero automatically apply to all missed submissions. Therefore, you must send me a message within 24 hours of the missed deadline to invoke this clause - otherwise, the grade of zero stands.
 - o The zero grade will remain if you do not submit the approved assignment by the revised due date.
 - The clause does not apply to the Final Exam.

Withdraw Deadline

A professor may withdraw you up to the beginning of the final exam period for violation of the class attendance policy in which case you will receive a grade of "W". During a first or second attempt in the same course at Valencia, if you withdrawal or are withdrawn by the professor, you will receive a W (Withdrawn). You will not receive credit for the course, and the W will not be calculated in your grade point average; however, the enrollment will count in your total attempts in the specific course and have financial aid implications.
