



## **LEARNING ACTIVITIES**

A big part of learning about the humanities is experiencing the humanities firsthand! For all sections of my humanities courses, there is at least one field trip experience you can choose to take part in. Field trips from previous or current courses have included:

<u>Introduction to Humanities</u>: The Mennello Museum of American Art, Kissimmee Sculpture Experience (downtown walking tour of public artworks), Valencia's Own House Band Concert, Acoustic Guitar Concert, David Benoit (jazz pianist) Concert, "39 Steps" Theater Performance, "A Midsummer's Night Dream" Theater Performance, "Rollins Dance XXV" Recital

<u>Late Roman and Medieval Humanities</u>: "Beowulf" Theater Performance, Tour of the Islamic Society of Central Florida's Center for Peace, Tour of the Guang Ming Buddhist Temple

<u>Twentieth Century Humanities</u>: "Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf?" Theater Performance, Frank Lloyd Wright Walking Tour at Florida Southern College
