Course Description: Principles of oral communication common to speaking and listening. Emphasis on listening techniques, preparation, and delivery techniques for extemporaneous speaking.

Assignments

Speeches/Presentations: Students will present 3 major speeches during the course as well as several minor speeches and presentations. Speeches and presentations account for 400 points and 42% of your final grade.

Tests: Students will complete 3 tests based on the textbook and lecture material. Each test is worth 100 points. These 300 points account for 31.5% of each student's final grade.

100 pts: Test #1
 100 pts: Test #2
 100 pts: Test #3

Additional Homework and Assignments: Points will be awarded for several short assignments given throughout the term, some of which will be conducted in class while others will need to be completed outside of class. Assignments include:

• 10 pts: Syllabus Quiz

• 130 pts: Chapter Quizzes (Completed online in MyCommunicationLab)

• 20 pts: PowerPoint Presentation

These assignments account for 160 points and are worth 17% of each student's final grade.

Attendance and Participation (A&P): Students will receive a maximum of 6 points per class session for attendance and participation.

Attendance will be taken at the when class begins, after the break, and at the end of class. Failure to be present for any of those will results in a loss of two points. If you come in late after the beginning of class or after the break, the penalty will be reduced to one point.

I also reserve the right to deduct points for any of the following circumstances:

- Inappropriate behavior (including but not limited to sleeping, eating, using cellphone, being disruptive, etc.)
- Failure to participate in class activities
- Failure to observe proper speech etiquette (entering the classroom while a speech is being given, talking during a speech, etc.)

Students are expected to take part in all activities and discussions. A perfect A&P grade will account for 90 points. These 90 points are worth 9.5% of each student's final grade. A&P points can only be made up by attending another class session of the professor's that is covering the same material.

Extra Credit: Various extra credit opportunities will be offered throughout the course. All extra credit options will be presented to the full class; no individual extra credit assignments will be given.

A&P Bonus*: Students with a perfect A&P grade will receive 20 extra credit points added to their total points.

Attendance Only Bonus*: If you at least partially attend all class sessions, you will receive 10 extra credit points added to your total points.

Make-Up Policy

Homework: Assignments turned in or completed a week late will only receive a maximum of 50% of the possible points. Assignments will not be accepted more than one week late.

Speeches: If you miss the class in which your speech was due to be delivered, you are expected to deliver the speech at the next attended class meeting. Make-up speech grades will automatically be reduced by 20 points. Failure to deliver the speech at the next attended class meeting will result in a grade of 0. Alternatively, you may attend and present your speech to my other speech class during the same week as your due date (if available) for no loss of points.

Tests: If you miss a test, you may opt to take the test with my other speech class the same week (if available) for no loss of points. Otherwise, you will be expected to take a make-up test PRIOR to the start of the next class. Please be aware that make-up tests only consist of 10 questions and have a higher level of difficulty than the regular quizzes. Make-up quiz grades will automatically be reduced by 20 points. Failure to make up the quiz **prior** to the next attended class meeting will result in a grade of 0.

^{*}You will receive whichever of these will grant you the most points, not both.

Other Policies

Academic Honesty: You are required to follow Valencia policy regarding academic honesty. All work submitted by students is expected to be the result of the student's individual thoughts, research, and self-expression unless the assignment specifically states "group project." Any act of academic dishonesty will be handled in accordance with Valencia policy as set forth in the Student Handbook and Catalog. Any form of cheating, including plagiarism, will results in 0 points being awarded for a given quiz, speech, or assignment.

Attendance: You are expected to attend every class session from start to finish. Attendance will be taken 3 times during each class session...at the beginning of class, following the mid-way break, and at the end of class. Remember that attendance makes up part of your A&P grade.

In addition, students are only allowed to miss a maximum of three full classes and remain in the course. Any student who misses four full class sessions prior to start of Finals Week on April 27 will be automatically withdrawn from the course. After 2 missed classes as well as after 3 missed classes, you will receive a reminder of the policy via Atlas Email. If you attend another class session that is covering the same material, I will count that toward your class attendance.

Per Valencia Policy 4-07 (Academic Progress, Course Attendance and Grades, and Withdrawals), a student who withdraws from class before the established deadline for a particular term will receive a grade of "W". A student is not permitted to withdraw after the withdrawal deadline. **See Important Dates below for the Withdrawal Deadline for your part of term.** A student who is withdrawn by faculty for violation of the class attendance policy will receive a grade of "W". Any student who withdraws or is withdrawn from a class during a third or subsequent attempt in the same course will be assigned a grade of "F". Tardy Policy: All students are expected to be on time for all class sessions as well as return to class from the mid-way break on time.

Speech Decorum and Protocol: If you arrive at the classroom while a speech is being presented, wait until that speech is completed before entering. Failure to do so will result in the loss of A&P points. Also, do not leave the classroom while a speech is being presented. Doing so will result in the loss of A&P points. Show respect to your fellow students by being quiet and attentive during their presentations. All electronic devices, including laptops, should be closed during any student presentations.

Electronic Devices: Electronic devices, such as laptops, may be used for classroom-related activities such as note taking. Any observance of the use of electronic devices, including cellphones, for any other purpose will result in the loss of A&P points. All electronic devices, including laptops, should be closed during any student presentations.

Food: Students should not be eating during class. Eating during class time will result in a loss of A&P points. If you feel ill or a pressing need to eat something, step outside the class to do so and return when you are finished.
