Course Overview:

This course examines management theory, relevant applications and cases, self-management, teamwork, global awareness, and communication for the development of management competencies. This course covers management theories with an emphasis on the practice of management.

Course Description:

This course is a study of basic concepts and theories of management. The functional roles and processes for planning, leading, organizing, and controlling are emphasized. Other topics covered include, but are not limited to, team development, leadership, strategic development, decision making, ethics, diversity, and globalization.

Course Outcomes:

- Describe and discuss the elements of effective management.
- Identify environmental issues that impact management and develop strategies to adapt to these environments.
- Identify and explain issues involved in managing a diverse workforce and conduct necessary research to address these issues.
- Discuss and apply the planning, organizing, and control processes.
- Identify and discuss various theories related to the development of leadership skills, motivation techniques, teamwork, and effective communication.
- Identify and understand ethical and social responsibility issues.
- Identify and apply management theories to organizations.

These may be covered as discrete topics and/or integrated with other topic areas in order at the discretion of the professor. These and other topics may be expanded or elaborated at the discretion of the individual professor and is in no way intended to be comprehensive or all-inclusive.
