HALLMARK CORE ASSIGNMENTS

[1] **PASSIONS** PAPER- [typed] - critical paper to YOUR SUCCESS!

This paper will be TYPED, DOUBLE spaced. It should be about 1-2 pages in length. The paper is a definitive statement about what you love to do. WHAT IS YOUR PASSION: what would you LOVE to do to earn money? What would you desire to have a job doing: that thing that you would do for FREE and /or for PAY? What is your `calling' in life? Where do you self-actualize?

[2] GOALS PAPER - [typed] MANDATORY, REQUIRED TO PASS]

This paper must be TYPED and DOUBLE spaced. It should be about 2-4 pages in length. The paper is a self-assessment of your plans, in the short, mid-range and distant future. Your paper should span the time period from today until the next '10' years [up to 20 years]. Your paper should conclude with how you plan to accomplish in each area.

Focus your GOALS: EDUCATIONAL, CAREER, PERSONAL

SHORT TERM GOALS – these goals are your plans from now through the next '1' year; discuss your objectives for reaching these goals;

MID RANGE GOALS – these goals are 2-4 years in length; explain your objectives for reaching these goals [what mindset is needed];

LONG TERM GOALS – these goals are up to `10' years in length; detail your objectives for reaching these goals [be flexible for change]

[3] CAREER EXPLORATION Paper – [typed] [MANDATORY, REQUIRED TO PASS THIS COURSE]

This paper will be TYPED and double-spaced. PLEASE REFER TO THE STUDENT LIFE SKILLS PORTFOLIO FOR COMPLETE DIRECTIONS ON HOW TO PROPERLY DO THIS PAPER. The paper is your charted journey describing your educational plans at Valencia. Do you plan to graduate from Valencia? If so, then which (AA degree) will you earn and when will you graduate? Your major and course requirements? MANDATORY!

You MUST do a 'job interview' with a person who works in your field of choice. Seek out a person whom you can job shadow (AS degree). Please attach the business card of the interviewee and business.

SLS Assessments: (4) assessments must be completed: Discovery Wheel, Learning Styles Inventory, Keirsey, BARSCH, and True Colors Assessment Inventories. You will discover that there is more to you than you ever thought or dreamed. You will realize WHY and HOW you process information. [Assessments are completed online via links]

<u>SLS Notebook</u>: Each student is REQUIRED to maintain a student notebook as Notebook Organization is part of your grade.

SLS Final Exam & Exit Exam: You will get the take-home **portion** of the exam when we return from Thanksgiving break! You will be given a final exam as the in-class portion of the MANDATORY FINAL.
