Facts

- 1. Used large quantities of paint for three-dimensional effect
- 2. Son of a Protestant Pastor
- 3. Served as a Pastor, but had awkward personal and social skills
- 4. Sold only one painting
- 5. Brother Theo cared for him
- 6. Confined twice in a mental institution
- 7. Committed suicide at age 37

C. Paul Gauguin (1848-1903)

Facts

- 1. Amateur painted for years, professionally a stockbroker
- 2. Gave up his career, wife, and family to be a professional painter

- 4. Created new paints from flowers bright colors
