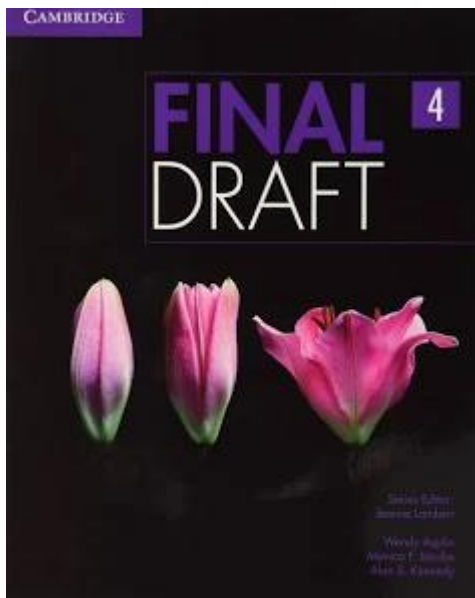

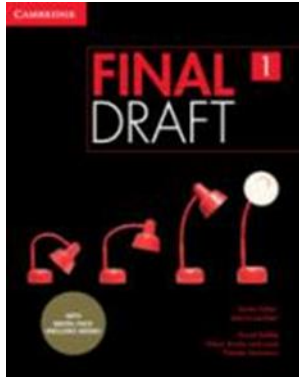

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## **Comprehensive Departmental Final Exam**

- You will have access to the Final Exam during designated dates.

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## Homework and Essays

Your work for EAP 1640 will come from three sources, and I will explain each of these in the first couple of weeks of our summer semester

1. Your textbook: I will specifically let you know if you need to submit a homework assignment in on paper that is NOT on Canvas. Most of the time, I will assign practices from the textbook as quizzes in Canvas based on practices from the textbook that you will submit through Canvas.
  2. CambridgeOne: This is a website where you will find practices that will support and enhance your writing skills.
  3. Writing Essays: You will submit these essays online through Canvas.
    - Typed essay assignments must be done according to MLA format. Format refers to the visual presentation of an assignment. MLA format is the most common style of the three primary format methods. I have examples with directions posted in the Welcome Module in Modules in Canvas.
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## Academic Dishonesty and Academic Integrity

Plagiarism, the act of copying someone else's work and putting your name to it, is a form of cheating. If you copy someone else's work and put your name on it, that act is considered plagiarism. - Be advised that your essays will be reviewed for plagiarism. If any plagiarized content is included in your essays, no credit will be given. Do NOT use any outside resources, including the Internet, to complete your essays. If there is any evidence of plagiarized content in your writing, the grade on the assignment will automatically be a zero.
