Human Body – Orientation- Ch.1 Chemistry – Biochemistry- Ch. 2 Cells - Ch. 3 Tissue - Ch. 4


Then the course covers the following body systems:

Exams with HonorLock

- 9. You are NOT permitted to photograph, copy, record or document by any means the test the test questions or images or any content related to the exams.
- 10. You are not permitted to use notes, books, the internet or your phone.
- 11. You may not give or receive assistance to or from anyone with these exams.

You will also need to download, and install, the smartphone app Microsoft Lens and install it on your

smartphone. This app turns your smartphone into a document scanner and saves your document into a single pdf document you can upload to Canvas. It is available for both Android and iOS phones and you will need it to turn in your chapter study guides (see below) and any other paper-based assignment this semester.

LABORATORY PROCEDURE

No food or drink in the labs! When using microscopes, be sure to handle them with care. Laboratory specimens MAY NOT be removed from the lab – that is considered THEFT! Do not mark anatomical specimens (for example bones) with pencils or pens. Clean up your lab station and wash your hands before leaving the lab.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

- 1. To understand and apply the basic concepts of anatomy and physiology
- 2. To develop critical thinking, analytical and problem-solving skills
- 3. To model professional career attitudes and behaviors

VI. SUCCESSFUL STRATEGIES

- 1. Attend every class and bring your text and lab manual with you to class. Prepare before class by scanning the assignments that will be covered that day.
- 2. Study every day you should plan to study 2-3 hours outside of class for every hour you spend in class. Review notes after class to convert information from short-term to long-term memory. Study TWO HOURS EACH DAY in order to successfully pass this class.
- **3.** Be sure to ORGANIZE the notes to make studying easier. Use a magic marker to highlight the important points.
- 4. Learning anatomical terms is like learning a new language and it is very important that you learn and UNDERSTAND definitions. Try creating flash cards with the term on one side and its definition on the other and run through them frequently. These are great study tools prior to an exam.
- 5. Join a study group. Meet frequently, compare notes and try testing each other.
- 6. Do not just blindly memorize material try and understand it. On exams you need to be able to apply the concepts not just what you have memorized.
- 7. Keep on pace don't fall behind.
- 8. If you do not understand something in lecture or lab, don't be afraid to ask questions in class. Alternately set up an appointment with the professor.
- 9. There is a lot to learn in a short time. You will need to maintain a positive attitude and maintain a high level of motivation
