No textbook is required for this course. Required class materials are on Canvas. Students are responsible for learning and implementing the information in the Canvas modules.

Prerequisite: Demonstration of required level of English proficiency OR minimum grade of C in EAP 0300. Corequisite: None

Course Description/Objective: Students continue to develop speaking and listening skills necessary for participation in classroom discussions, with an emphasis on oral presentation.

Competencies: 1) intermediate academic speaking skills with introduction to oral presentation, 2) listening comprehension and note taking strategies, 3) classroom interaction skills.

In order to pass this course, student must earn a C or above in course work. Credit does not apply to any associate degree.

Withdrawal policy: A student who withdraws from class before the withdrawal deadline will receive a grade of W. A student is not permitted to withdraw after the deadline; if a student remains in the class after the deadline, (s)he can only receive a grade of A, B, C, D, F or I. An I grade will only be assigned under extraordinary circumstances that occur near the end of the semester. The professor will not withdraw any student; it is the responsibility of the student to withdraw before deadline and to be aware of the date of the deadline. Withdrawal may affect financial aid. *Important Note for International Students (F-1 or J-1 Visa):* Be advised that withdrawal may negatively impact your visa status. Consult the International Student Services office for more information on full-time enrollment requirements. **Withdrawal deadline: March 15**

Class Policies

Failure to comply with all of the following policies, as determined by the instructor, will result in students' grades being lowered.

- 1. Attendance, arriving on time, and staying until the instructor dismisses the class is required.
- All members of the class are required to adhere to the Valencia College Student Code of Conduct (<u>https://catalog.valenciacollege.edu/academicpoliciesprocedures/studentcodeofconduct/</u>). Students must be respectful and courteous to classmates and the instructor at all times. Disrupting the learning environment and disturbing others in the classroom as determined by the instructor is prohibited.
- 3. Phones must be silenced and put away out of sight (unless otherwise instructed by the instructor).
- 4. Talking out of turn in class is prohibited. Students raise their hands and wait to be called on by the instructor. No student speaks in class without being instructed by the instructor to do so.
- 5. Students must follow instructions for class activities without delay or protest.
- 6. All class work must be submitted on the assigned dates and at the moment that the instructor requests submission. Late submissions are not accepted. Deviation from this will result in a score of zero for unsubmitted work.
- 7. Students are responsible for demonstrating mastery of the curriculum per the instructions provided in class and on Canvas.
- Scores/Grades are not negotiable. Assessment is grounded in equity/fairness. Grades are based on student performance/demonstration of learning per the objectives and requirements of the course – not on requests or 'special circumstances.' Scores on class work are earned by the student. The instructor merely records scores.
- 9. There are no extra credit options.
- 10. Students are responsible for monitoring their own grades throughout the semester.
- 11. Students are responsible for staying up-to-date with all class information announced by the instructor in class and on Canvas.
- 12. Academic dishonesty (cheating) will result in a score of zero. The instructor determines if academic dishonesty has occurred. This is non-negotiable.
- 13. The learning environment/instructor-student relationship is cooperative, not adversarial.
