**Catalog Course Description:** Designed to survey examine theory and research on human development from conception through death. Emphasizes biological, physical, cognitive, social, emotional, and cultural variables which influence human behavior development. Prerequisite: PSY 2012.

**Major Topics/Concepts/Skills/Issues:**

- Scientific research and theories on human development.
- Cultural influences on human development.
- Genetics, prenatal development, and birth.
- Physical development from conception through death.
- Cognitive development from birth through death.
- Social and emotional development from birth through death.
- Dying, death, and bereavement.

**Learning Outcomes:**

1. Interpret developmental research and the application of the scientific method to the study of human development across the lifespan analyze the complexities (e.g., ethical, physical, cultural factors) of dying, death, and bereavement and its impact on humans across the lifespan.
2. Discuss how cultural influences impact development across the lifespan.
3. Summarize the ways genetics, the prenatal period, and the birthing process impact development.
4. Analyze physical development of humans from conception through death.
5. Analyze cognitive development of humans from birth through death.
6. Analyze social and emotional development of humans from birth through death.
7. Analyze the complexities (e.g., ethical, physical, cultural factors) of dying, death, and bereavement and its impact on humans across the lifespan.

**Instructor Course Description:** In this course students will study Developmental Psychology, which is the study of how and why humans develop and change over their lifespan. It is my hope students will not only learn the content of this course but apply the course knowledge through reflection and integration to gain a greater understanding of oneself and others. This online Developmental Psychology course is essentially an *independent interactive study* course. This course is designed to reflect Valencia Community College's learner-centered philosophy and is recommended for students who are highly motivated, self-disciplined, and self-directed. The primary resource for course material will be the textbook with Connect access and the internet. All students are required to have access to the Connect Code, internet, and the Canvas platform as this is an online course. (There are no exceptions)

**Note:** This class requires participation in discussions to meet course-learning outcomes. We are a class comprised of individuals. As such, there will be multiple opinions expressed throughout the semester that you may not personally agree with or even understand - as may be expected. My role as an instructor is to facilitate academic discussions that are relevant to the course, credible, open, and respectful without the promotion or endorsement of a single viewpoint. Conversations informed by diverse viewpoints contribute to critical thinking and higher-level learning. Even if you don't agree, listening to different points of view may give you further insight into your own perspectives. No lesson is intended to espouse, promote, advance, inculcate, compel a particular feeling, perception, viewpoint, or belief in a concept. Concepts as presented are not endorsed by the instructor but are presented as part of the larger course of instruction. Should a student feel uncomfortable with how course content is presented or discussed, please contact the instructor for further conversation.

**Methodology: Assessment** methods used in this course include online class discussion board participation, SB readings with assessments, the Quest Journey comprehensive interactive digital learning experience, and a final exam.

**Grading: Total Possible Points 1000**

500 points: SmartBook reading and assessments (25pts each)

250 points: Quest Journey interactive assignments (25pts each)

150 points: Discussion Board Participation (30pts each)

100 points: **Final Exam: late submissions will not be accepted. \*See weekly course schedule**

## ASSIGNMENTS:

The specific due dates for assignments are specified in the weekly course schedule and weekly announcements in the Canvas course and are available beginning 24 hours before the course start date (see weekly course schedule under the orientation module). 1. Review the Simple Syllabus, Supplemental Course Information, Orientation Module and Weekly Course Schedule completely, then take time to explore the online virtual classroom in Canvas to understand the learning environment and access to Connect Assignments. Ask course questions by posting under Course Questions on the discussion board, which will benefit other learners who may have the same question. I will respond to these questions in a timely manner.
2. Participate in all Weekly Discussions with a minimum of 1 required post per week as follows: For each week a discussion board question/assignment is assigned, students are **required** to go to the Discussion Board and open the current weekly Discussion Board for the week. (see Modules and Weekly course schedule) Students are to respond to the assignment by writing **1 substantial participation post (minimum 1 paragraph/approximately 100-125 words) to demonstrate an understanding of a major concept that has not been explained and posted on from the assigned reading chapter (s).** Each student needs to check the discussion board to avoid duplicate postings on the same concept. Students are encouraged to participate more than the

minimum of 1 required post to contribute to the dialogue. Late discussion posts will not be graded. Please review the grading rubric.

3. Complete all course assignments by the due dates. **Mark your calendar of the final exam date, day, time, and time zone.** (See weekly course schedule under the Orientation section of the Modules tab in the course)
4. Check the Course Announcements and email communications when logging into the course. (minimum 2 times/week for any updates.)

### **Helpful Tips for Success in this Course:**

**Don't fall behind** – Plan ahead! Follow the schedule closely and complete assignments on time or early.

**Discussion Board**-discussion board assignments and participation are focused on the application and discussion of psychological concepts and theories related to the course material.
