

Students are to create a project dealing with something that 'peeked' your interest in our studies during the semester. You may choose anything that we have covered in Chapters 1, 2, 3, 7, 8. Students will be given some class time to work on their projects – to utilize the college library or computer labs. The project is worth 100 points. Requirements are:

- Something that you made, created, built, pasted, glued, drew, cut-out, - a hand-made project. Nothing bought or pre-made will count. Use your brain to think of something the class would like to learn about.
- Write a **Full-page, typed report** dealing with accurate research plus information that you plan to present to the class. Be sure to include your name on it. Make **2 copies** of the report – 1 to refer to when speaking to the class & 1 to give to me before presentation. Please, do not read to us. Practice what you have learned and talk to the class about it.
- Do not read your report out loud – I would like you to try to speak or teach the class
- Presentations** should be only about **2-4 minutes** – see the syllabus for presentation date
- Projects are to be **portable**. Do not discard or leave them at the college when finished. Take them home or donate them to someone who wants it
- Projects will be **graded on the thought & effort** put into them; not on the presentation. This is an opportunity to earn a better grade and a fun way to learn with your family and friends.
- Keep the costs down by using leftover 'stuff' at home or by purchasing items at a true Dollar store
- If you cook or bake something, please supply utensils, napkins, plates, and the much needed - Trash Bag
- It is your responsibility to come up with the idea – that is what the grade is all about

--When all presentations are done, I will give back all of your reports with a grade on it. **Students who are absent on either day of presentations will have -75 pts deducted from their grade. Make sure to come to both classes!** Students who do not present anything or miss presenting to your own class – will fail this course. No makeup.

--If you have any doubts about your idea, you may see me after class to make sure it will be acceptable
