Terms to Identify, Define, and Know for Testing

1. **Polis** (define what this means to be living there in Greece)
2. **Homer** (who was he, when did he live, famous for?)
 - a- ***The Iliad*** (What is this, what is it about, why is it famous?)
 - b- ***The Odyssey*** (same as above)
3. **Kore / Kouros**
4. ***Kritios Boy***
5. **Ethos** (of music)
6. **Dorian Music / Phrygian Music**
7. **Dithyramb** (Define it; How does it relate to Greek drama)
8. **Hesiod** – (who is he; lived when? & what did he do)
 - a. ***Theogony*** – (explain what this is and what it is about)
 - b. ***Works and Days*** (same as above)
9. **Lyric poetry** – per the early period of Greece
10. **Sappho**
11. **Philosophy**
12. **Presocratic Philosophers** – (in general)
13. **Herodotus** (famous for? Known as? Lived when?)
 - a. ***A History of the Persian Wars*** (why is this famous?)
14. **Hubris** (per the textbook)
15. **The Battle of Marathon** (name the war, the year, & tell why this battle is important)
