

This is your Final. Any student who chooses to skip this assignment will not pass this course. There is no makeup.

Students are to create a project dealing with something that piques your interest in our studies during the semester. You may choose anything from Chapters 6 – 11 in our text. The project is worth 100 points.

Requirements include:

--Creating a **2-page typed report** dealing with information good research and information that you plan to present to the class. Students are to make **2 copies** of the report – 1 to refer to when speaking to the class; 1 for me to have when I am grading your presentation. Make sure that **your name and word count is on the report.**

--**Presentations** should be only about **2-4 minutes** – see the syllabus about the date of presentations

--Do not read your report to us. – I would like you to try to speak or teach the class. It is a PRESENTATION.

--Projects are to be **portable**. Do not discard or leave them at the college when finished.

--Projects will be **graded on** the thought & **effort** put into them and not on the presentation. This is an opportunity to better your grade and a fun way to learn with your family or friends.

--Keep the costs down by using leftover 'stuff' at home or by purchasing items at a Dollar Tree

--If you cook or bake something, please supply utensils, napkins, plates, and the much needed - Trash Bag

--It is your responsibility to come up with the idea – that is what the grade is all about

--At the end of the very last presentation, I will hand back your reports with a grade on it. **Students who are absent on either day of presentations will have -75 deducted from their grade. Make sure to come to both classes!**

--If you have any doubts about your idea, you may see me after class to make sure it will be acceptable. Or, do some research at the college library for ideas.
