COURSE DESCRIPTION

Catalog Description

This course uses a case study, experiential/simulated learning approach to build upon and apply Human Resources Management concepts. Students will develop and apply their communication, employee relations skills and problem-solving and decision-making abilities to cases that reflect work-related, human resources challenges.

COURSE OUTCOMES

- 1. Students will demonstrate knowledge and understanding of current issues and challenges in HR management.
- 2. Students will demonstrate knowledge of the relevant laws regarding HR.
- 3. Students will summarize employee relations issues.
- 4. Students will summarize recruitment, training and development, and retention issues.
- 5. Students will summarize performance management issues.
- 6. Student will summarize past and current issues regarding compensation and benefits.

Withdrawal Policy

Per <u>Valencia policy</u> a student who withdraws from class before the established deadline for a particular term will receive a grade of "W. A student is not permitted to withdraw after the withdrawal deadline.

A faculty member can withdraw a student up to the withdrawal deadline for violation of the class attendance policy. A student who is withdrawn by faculty for violation of the class attendance policy will receive a grade of "W". After the withdrawal deadline, faculty will not withdraw a student and the student will receive the grade earned at the end of the course. Any student who withdraws or is withdrawn from a class during a third or subsequent attempt in the same course will be assigned a grade of "F." If you do not intend to complete the course, you must withdraw yourself prior to the withdrawal date.
