**Course Description/Objective:** Students develop ability to compose longer texts on a variety of academically related topics by applying appropriate writing and grammar strategies. In this course, a minimum grade of C (70%) is required for successful completion.

#### **NOTE—Grammar Readiness:**

You are expected to be proficient in the following grammar skills before attempting EAP 1585.

- Verb tenses: simple present, present progressive, simple past, past progressive, simple future, present perfect, and present perfect progressive
- Question forms and negative forms for all above tenses
- Basic modals
- Adverbs of frequency
- Adjectives: comparative and superlative adjectives, order of adjectives, -ing/-ed adjectives
- Nouns: singular/plural, count/noncount, regular/irregular, and expressions of quantity
- Articles
- Conditional "if" for real conditions
- Pronouns (subject, object, possessive)
- Gerunds as subjects/objects
