CATALOG DESCRIPTION:

Accounting concepts, principles, procedures and underlying theories applicable to the nature of accounting. Accounting for corporations including financial statements, accounting cycle, current assets, plant and equipment, other long-term assets, current liabilities, long-term debt, and stockholders' equity.

- Prerequisite: Minimum grade of C in MAC 1105 or APA 1111C or MTB 1103.

METHOD OF INSTRUCTION: This is an online course. All of the learning activities and assignments are required to be

completed using computer software and Canvas. This course consists of reading, discussions, review practice quizzes, submission of homework and tests. Most of the

assignments must be submitted no later than the DUE date.

COMPETENCIES:



REQUIRED MATERIALS:

For this course, you will need both the textbook (e.g. eBook or hardcopy) and the McGraw-Hill CONNECT Access Code.





• Textbook: Fundamental Financial Accounting Concepts, by Edmonds, McNair, Milam and Olds, 11th Edition. The custom designed edition of this text is packaged at the West Campus bookstore or online at https://www.valenciabookstores.com/ and is sold at a substantial discount over the original hardcover textbook.

For this course, you will need to purchase access code to the McGraw-Hill CONNECT System. This is an online System where you can access both the full, interactive E-Textbook for the course AND all your required assignments.

Here some important notes to keep in mind when choosing this option:

- You MUST take both this **course** Principles of Financial Accounting (ACG2021C) and Managerial Accounting (ACG2071C) in consecutive semesters. If you drop, fail, don't complete the course or change your mind, the CONNECT access will may not extend beyond two consecutive semesters. The bookstore will not be offering refunds for such cases.
- You MUST take both courses here on the West Campus (on-campus, online or hybrid) to take advantage of this discount. This discounted bundle does NOT extend to other Valencia campuses.

FREE TRIAL: As you are making your decision, you can sign up for a free trial version of the CONNECT System, which will last for a few weeks while you are getting up and running in the course. LEARNING OUTCOMES:

Upon the completion of this course, the student should be able to:

1. Analyze business transactions using the accounting equation.

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- 2. Record asset, liability, equity, revenue and expense transactions into a company's accounting system.
- 3. Prepare the four financial statements in accordance with current accounting standards.
- 4. Complete all the steps in the accounting cycle.
- 5. Calculate the value of inventory using all four methodologies.
- 6. Analyze a company's financial data in order to facilitate economic decision-making.
- 7. Explain the importance of Ethics in the Accounting Industry.

GRADING COMPOSITION:

Your grade will be determined by a POINT SYSTEM. The POINTS you earn on THREE exams, quizzes, individual and/or group assignments, class participation, attendance and any additional <u>project</u> or cases assigned will be totaled and then divided by the total number of points possible in a grading period. The result will be a percentage grade semester. **Details on these assignments will be given in class**. Each exam will cover information given in the discussions, lectures, and active learning sessions. Final letter grades are assigned using the following **scale** based on total possible points.

This scale includes adjustments made for the subjective nature of grading; rounding will be if .5 or > .5 next number; the cutoff is rigid. **For example**, if we have 600 total points, 537 points represent 90% A and 536 points is an 89% B.

* Extra Credit: I strongly suggest you do not miss out any opportunities to earn points. Every point counts!

EVALUATION:

You will get the grade you earn in this course. An "A" means excellent and a "C" is average. If you turn in average work you can expect an average grade. I do <u>not</u> give away grades. You should plan spending about six to eight hours per week on the reading, assignments and discussions, even though how you break up that time is completely up to you.

- 1. The student will benefit from learning accounting concepts by applying *Internet-based skills* to this course using *Canvas* and *Connect System*.

- b. Assignments must be submitted via McGraw-Hills Connect System no later than the DUE date.

 Assignments will not be accepted late.

- a. Any Extra-Credit quizzes or assignments of this course enabled by Canvas are timed (maximum 15 minutes approximately). It will be only allowed ONE-ATTEMPT with 15 or 60 minutes each attempt.
 Once you enter the extra-point assignment, you must complete it.
- 7. Failure to take the <u>final exam</u> will result in an "F" grade or zero points on the test.

GUIDELINES FOR CONNECT HOMEWORK SYSTEM:

Below are few tips for your *Connect* System:

- In order to get registered in **CONNECT SYSTEM**, you must click on the first homework assignment available in Canvas under **CONNECT SYSTEM** forum provided in this course menu in Canvas. Then, the system will automatically take you to the screen where you can buy online the e-book with the access code and/or get registered into **CONNECT SYSTEM** using the registration access code that came with your new textbook. Then, follow the instructions provided in each screen. *You must use your Valencia College e-mail address during your registration process into the Connect System*. If you do *not* have a code, you can enter your credit card information and purchase access directly at the same site or you can buy it at the bookstore in Valencia College-West Campus.
- You can <u>only</u> do one thing at a time. You cannot view past results while you are in the process of taking an assignment. You **cannot** take TWO graded assignments at the same time.
- When trying to print an assignment use the browser's **Print Preview** and **Page Setup** options to get the best output possible. You should switch from portrait to landscape, and should extend the margins as far as possible.
- Use the "Next", "Back", "Jump To", and "Save my work" buttons periodically to save and avoid timing out. If there is no activity within 60 minutes, CONNECT SYSTEM will automatically log out your session.
- Click "Quit and Save" if you wish to work on your assignment later without grading. Remember, you can only
 work on one open, not graded assignment at one time.
- **Do not** *copy* and *paste*, this might enter illegal characters in your homework and prevent you from getting a grade.
- You will have the opportunity to take practice quizzes. **Extra-points** individual or teamwork assignments/case studies could be or not announced prior the date that is assigned.

CRN 22087 ONLINE WITHDRAWAL POLICY:

SUGGESTIONS:

A Method of Study:

No one can effectively prepare for a journey without first consulting road maps and travel guides. In the same way, no one can prepare for a textbook without first pre-reading the material. The following is a method of study:

- Examine the outside references of a textbook. The title tells you what the text is about, and the blurb on a book gives you more of a synopsis of the material.
- Scan over the index in the back of a book. The topics with the most references expose an author's biases. It shows the priority of concerns to the author.
- **Read the author's preface.** This section reveals the author's philosophy in presenting the course material. You will understand his/her objective with the current book.
- The Table of context shows the structure the author is using to achieve his/her objective. A well-prepared table of context also supplies the major topics of the text. These topics provide reference points on the road to mastering the text.
- *Use the subtopics revealed in each chapter*. These subtopics are usually presented as Chapter Objectives, Chapter Summaries, Section Headings (usually in bold face fonts), and questions at the end of each chapter.
- Turn each subtopic into a question by using the words: who, what, where, when, why and how.
- With a highlighter in hand, read through the text searching for the answer to this question. When the answer is discovered, highlight the answer and move on to your next question.
- After completing the chapter, close the book and trying writing out the answers to your questions. This becomes your first test on the material. When finished, compare your answers to the highlighted answers in the text. Correct any errors made. Then turn your paper over and retake the questions answered incorrectly.
- For each question, try to find the key word or phrase in the answer. This key word or phrase can be used in your notebook and index cards for a quick review of the material.
