Course Description

Algebra preparation for the calculus sequence. Topics include a symbolical, graphical, and numerical analysis of polynomials, exponential, logarithmic, power, and rational functions; matrices, sequences, induction, binomial theorem and conic sections. Applications emphasizing connections with other disciplines and with the real world will be included. Technology tools will be utilized in addition to analytical methods. Minimum grade of C required if MAC 1140 is used to satisfy Gordon Rule and general education requirements. Credit will not be given for both MAC 1140 and any of the following: MAC 1132, MAC 1142, MAC 1147. 3 credit hours.

 - Generate the terms using the definition of sequence and series.
 - Find the sum of a series.
 - Find the formula for the nth general term given the terms.
 - Solve applications of sequences and series.

Textbook and Required Materials

Textbook

You are required to purchase access to MyLab Math (the online homework system and online textbook for A Graphical Approach to Precalculus with Limits, 7th Edition, by Hornsby, Lial, and Rockswold ISBN 1323918264 / 9781323918265). This access code can be purchased through the online Valencia bookstore and contains the course eBook. The hard-copy textbook for the course is optional. Directions on where to enter the access code are provided in the week 1 module in Canvas (our learning management system and location of all course materials).

All Homework, Quizzes, and Exams will be competed using MyLab Math embedded in Canvas. For MyLab Math technical support, you will need to <u>submit a Tech Support Issue</u>. After you enter your information, you will get a case number and a phone number to call if needed. MyLab Math staff are available to troubleshoot any technical problems that you may encounter with their software. You can reach out to me if you are experiencing a technical issue and I will do my best to assist. If I am unable to help, then I will help you identify the best contact for support.

Graphing Calculator

A TI 84 graphing calculator is required for this course and is what I use in the online videos. It will be helpful in verifying graphing problems and performing complex and tedious computations. If you use another graphing calculator, I will do the best I can to assist you, but please know that it may take me a little longer to respond to your needs. If you do not have a calculator, you can check one out and pick it up from at the Osceola campus. Additionally, Desmos has free graphing technology, and wabbitemu and GrafNCalc 8 are free apps available on cellphones. If you are receiving financial aid, it may be possible to utilize some of your funds to purchase your calculator. Check with the financial aid office for more information.

Grading Breakdown

Your grade will be calculated based on the following categories:

1. Discussions (10% of Final Course Grade: 5 discussions worth 2% each)
There will be five discussion prompts in Canvas that you will be required to post an initial reply to as well as responses to your peers posts. You must follow the directions per each prompt in order to earn full credit (a rubric is provided in Canvas). The due dates for the discussion posts can be found in the course schedule.

Discussion Deadline Policy: I do not allow extensions on discussions. Think of a discussion as a conversation – if you participate late, the conversation had already ended. I encourage you to get your discussions done earlier in the week as opposed to on the due date, so that if an unexpected circumstance arises, your discussion is already complete.

2. Homework (20% of Final Course Grade)

There will be a homework assignment through MyLab Math posted in Canvas for each section covered in the modules. Completion of homework on a regular basis is crucial to your success in this course. It is automatically graded when submitted. Each homework problem can be attempted as many times as possible until you achieve a mastery of the topic. You have unlimited attempts until the due date. The due dates for the homework assignments can be found in the course schedule.

Homework Deadline Policy: Please do your best and work ahead of schedule to get your homework done early. Timely, successful completion of homework is critical to success on quizzes and exams. I realize that unexpected emergencies happen. Please reach out to me ASAP if you are unable to complete an assignment as a result of an emergency. I reserve the right to determine if the emergency warrants an extension on any assignment.

3. Quizzes (20% of the Final Course Grade: 5 quizzes worth 4% each)
There will be five quizzes through MyLab Math posted in Canvas worth 4% each. The
quizzes are timed and must be completed in one sitting. You will want to make sure that you
secure a reliable Internet connection when taking the online quizzes. A list of the objectives
that are covered on the quizzes will be provided in advance. The due dates for the quizzes
can be found in the course schedule.

Quiz Deadline Policy: If you get "locked out" of a quiz in advance of the due date of the quiz, I will reopen the quiz for you to allow you to reenter. This can be very stressful for you, so please make sure you have a reliable internet connection before starting a quiz. I realize that unexpected emergencies happen. 4. Exams (50% of the Final Course Grade: 2 exams worth 25% each)
There will be a midterm exam and a final exam through MyLab Math posted in Canvas worth 25% each. The exams are timed and must be completed in one sitting. You will be required to show your work and submit your work for each problem by uploading a pdf file into Canvas. You can record your work with a tablet/stylus or if you write your work on paper, you can scan it to submit it. If you do not own a scanner, you can scan your work using a number of free apps on your phone. I also include instructions on how to use CamScanner (a popular free scanning app) with the exam directions. Once your exam is submitted, you will have 10 minutes after the submission time to upload your scanned work

in Canvas. If the work is late or if it is missing, you will earn a zero for the exam. Exams will be open to take for the duration of at least four days. A list of the objectives that are covered on the exam as well as a review for each exam will be provided in advance. The due dates of the exams can be found in the course schedule.

Exam Deadline Policy: Extensions for exams will only be considered for emergency circumstances. You must contact me within 24 hours of the exam deadline (unless it is physically impossible to do so) if an emergency circumstance is preventing you from completing your exam by the deadline. I reserve the right to determine if the emergency warrants the extension of the exam deadline, and I may request documentation from you regarding the emergency. Please do not wait until the last day to take your exam.

Attendance and Withdrawal Policy
