Course Overview

Students will choose a major and articulate a pathway to complete their academic and career goals. Topics in the course include defining your purpose, demonstrating awareness of college support systems, communicating effectively, navigating college sources, applying college success skills, and designing an education plan and creating a financial plan.

Student Core Competencies

Valencia's Student Core Competencies are complex abilities that are essential to lifelong success. This course will help you develop and demonstrate the abilities to (1) think clearly, critically, and creatively; (2) communicate with others verbally and in written form; (3) make reasoned value judgments and responsible commitments; and (4) act purposefully, reflectively, and responsibly.

- Students will demonstrate effective communication skills with diverse groups.
- Students will demonstrate awareness of college support systems.

Policies

Attendance: Because so much of the learning is cumulative, interactive and participatory, attendance is a must! Attendance is required at your assigned class. You should be on time to each class, complete all assignments, and remain in class for the entire time unless prior permission has been given by the instructor to leave early. **Three (3)** absences, without adequate excuse, may result in withdrawal from the courses.

Students are responsible for all work presented when they are absent and are also responsible for any announcements made in class. In the event you are going to miss class, it is YOUR responsibility to find out what you missed. Please email or call me as soon as possible so we can work together to help you stay caught up.

Tardiness/Talking: Show up! Please be on time for class. To be successful in this course, students should make every effort to attend all classes in its entirety. As to not disrupt others in the class, please refrain from sidebar conversations. Questions during class are always accepted as long as they are relevant to the lecture.

Make up/Late Work: All work is due on or before the posted due date. Work turned in at any point after its due date is considered late and will NOT be accepted unless you have documentation of an emergency (illness, jury duty, etc.) and is at the discretion of the instructor. If at all possible, students who anticipate missing class should hand in work BEFORE the due date to avoid any grade penalties.

Electronic Devices: Turn <u>OFF</u> your cell phone and all other electronic devices and put them away before class starts. Texting and use of electronic devices in class causes you to lose focus and causes distractions for others. If you have an emergency situation that requires your cell phone to be on, please notify your instructors at the beginning of class.

Class Participation: You should consider being a student as a full-time job. You should attend all classes, study sessions, participate in class, ask relevant questions, turn in assignments when they are due, and ask for help when needed. Assignments are expected to be completed before each class session. In addition, you are expected to come to class prepared to contribute to discussions of the topics and materials and actively engage in class discussions. You can't participate if you are not in class!

Co-Curricular Activities: It is required that students complete (3) Co-Curricular activities before the end of the term. This is an out of class requirement and must be done on your on time. Please plan accordingly.

Withdrawal Policy: Per Valencia Policy, a student is permitted to withdraw from a class **on or before the withdrawal deadline of a term, as published in the College calendar.** A student is not permitted to withdraw from a class after the withdrawal deadline. A student who withdraws from a class before the withdrawal deadline will receive a grade of "W." If a student remains in class after the withdrawal deadline, he/she can only receive a grade of A, B, C, D, F or I. Any student who withdraws or is withdrawn from a class during a third or subsequent attempt in the same course will be assigned a grade of "F." The grades of "WP" and "WF" are eliminated.

A faculty member is permitted to withdraw a student from the faculty member's class up to the beginning of the final exam period, for violation of the faculty member's attendance policy, as published in the faculty member's syllabus. A faculty member is not permitted to withdraw a student from his/her class as a response to student conduct which falls under the jurisdiction of the Student Code of Conduct (6Hx28:8-03). A student who is withdrawn by a professor at any time before the start of the final examination period will receive a grade of "W." After the Withdrawal Deadline: A student is not permitted to withdraw after the withdrawal deadline. A professor may withdraw you up to the beginning of the final exam period for violation of the class attendance policy in which case you will receive a grade of W.
