Course Description:

BSC 2094C is the continuation of BSC 2093C, including cardiovascular, lymphatic, respiratory, digestive, urinary, and reproductive systems with considerable emphasis on biochemistry of metabolic processes and body fluids. This course meets the General Education science requirements for graduation.

Course Outcomes:

- Students will identify the major components of the cardiovascular system. Students will relate the structure to the function of the major organs of the cardiovascular system.
- Students will identify the major components of the lymphatic system. Students will relate the structure to the function of the major organs of the lymphatic system. Students will relate the structure to the function of the immune response(s).
- Students will identify the major components of the respiratory system. Students will relate the structure to the function of the major organs of the respiratory system.
- Students will identify the major components of the digestive system. Students will relate the structure to the function of the major organs of the digestive system.
- Students will describe metabolism, including the mechanisms by which nutrients are ingested, processed, and utilized by the body.
- Students will identify the major components of the urinary system. Students will relate the structure to the function of the major organs of the urinary system.
- Students will explain the processes involved in fluid, electrolyte, and acid-base homeostasis.
- Students will identify the major components of the reproductive system. Students will relate the structure to the function of the major organs of the reproductive system.
