Students will be able to articulate the role of perception as it influences the definition of self and others. Students will demonstrate effective verbal and nonverbal communication skills for successful interpersonal communication.

Students will demonstrate interpersonal communication competence. Students will be able to manage and/or resolve circumstances of interpersonal conflict. Students will deliver

extemporaneous speech(es). Students will demonstrate small group dynamics and act appropriately.

NO SHOW POLICY

Class attendance is required for face to face and ONLINE. If you do not complete the first class assignment, you may be withdrawn from the class as a "no show." COMMUNICATION POLICY

All students must use their Valencia e-mail to communicate with the instructor. Remember that an e-mail to a professor is not an instant message! PROJECTS

PERSUASIVE PROJECT: (SPEECH)

Students will work on a project and utilize their interpersonal communication skills they have learned during the semester. This project will consist of developing a campaign to present to the class that positively changes a facet of the world. Previous campaigns have included: PETA, recycling, ending sex-trafficking, supporting a children's hospital, etc.

This assignment will prove challenging when different points of view arise on the feedback discussion posts. Creativity of visuals will garner higher presentation scores. Each presentation will be 5 minutes long and then will have questions and feedback that you will need to respond to in the forum discussions. You will need to have verbal and parenthetical citations in your presentations and on your power point slides as well as a Works Cited Slide. All presentations will be recorded and uploaded to YouTube. Make the presentation pubic so that your classmates may see it. Make the link available in the accompanying Discussion Thread so that your classmates may access it. (TIP: Present this as if you were going to get people to fund or vote for your cause. Previous campaigns have actually partnered with organizations and actually gotten votes or signatures to have policies adapted.) BE DRESSED EITHER PROFESSIONALLY OR REPRESENTING YOUR CAUSE. (T-SHIRT WITH LOGO, ETC.)

FORMAL SPEECH:

For your final exam you will give a 2-3 minute speech discussing what you learned throughout the course and how it has changed your various relationships. You will include your week one statements of expectations and fears in the speech as a basis for growth. Be sure to include various theories and how it has directly applied to your growth. Sell yourself in this presentation as if your answers and dress were going to get you the job or funding for the company you always wanted to create. **Professional business attire required**. **Further instructions will be issued.**
